Part of the explanation for Emerging adulthood is a phase of the life span between adolescence and full-fledged adulthood which encompasses late adolescence and early adulthood, proposed by Jeffrey Arnett in a 2000 article in the American Psychologist. It primarily describes people living in developed countries, but it is also experienced by young people in urban wealthy families in the Global South. The term describes young adults who do not have children, do not live in their own home, and/or do not have sufficient income to Emerging adulthood is also included because doing so reflects the profound changes that took place in the nature of "adolescence" in the twentieth century. In that time span, puberty moved about 2 years earlier in the life course of people in industrialized societies so that most young people now show the first physical changes of puberty at age 10 to 12. Meanwhile, since 1950 the typical age of entering marriage and parenthood has risen steeply; it is now in the late twenties in every industrialized country. Together, the readings should provide students with an understanding of how scholarship on adolescence and emerging adulthood is conducted now, in our time.
