They spoke over three hundred separate languages, some of which were as different from one another as English is from Chinese. Europeans called America "the New World." But it was not new to the Amerindians. South America. About 5,000 years later their camp fires were burning on the frozen southern tip of the continent, now called Tierra del Fuego-the Land of Fire. For many centuries early Amerindians lived as wandering hunters and gatherers of food. Then a more settled way of life began. Long before Europeans came to America the Pueblo were building networks of canals across the deserts to bring water to their fields. In one desert valley modern archaeologists have traced canals and ditches which enabled the Pueblo to irrigate 250,000 acres of farmland. 126 years later, a Time cover story on deep-sea exploration made much the same admission: "We know more about Mars than we know about the oceans." This reality begins to explain the dark power and otherworldly fascination of *Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Seas*. Born in the French river town of Nantes, Verne had a lifelong passion for the sea. First as a Paris stockbroker, later as a celebrated author and yachtsman, he went on frequent voyages-- to Britain, America, the Mediterranean. But the specific stimulus for this novel was an 1865 fan letter from a fellow writer, Madame George.
